This month, keep in mind the following DFC reminders:


- For programmatic questions and concerns, feel free to contact me, your assigned Project Officer.

Deadlines and Deliverables

- <u>Annual Performance Report (APR) for CARA Recipients ONLY</u> Guidance for the CARA APR, which serves as the noncompeting continuation application for Support Year 3 is now available in GrantSolutions. The APR is due **March 1, 2023**.
- <u>Annual Performance Report (APR) for DFC Recipients ONLY</u> Guidance for the APR, which serves as the noncompeting continuation application, is now available in GrantSolutions. This release is intended for recipients applying for *Support Years 2-5 and 7-10 only*. Additional support and Q&A is available and can be coordinated with your Project Officer and GMS. The APR is due *March 15, 2023*.
- <u>CARA Progress Report</u> CARA recipients are encouraged to monitor their inboxes for updates on the CARA progress report and its due date, which is tentatively **February 15, 2023**.
- **<u>DFC Competing Continuation Application</u>** For *Current Year 5* recipients who wish to compete for Year 6 DFC funding, the application has posted via <u>grants.gov</u>. Questions about the application can be emailed to <u>DFC_NOFO@cdc.gov</u>.
- <u>DFC Progress Report</u> The DFC Program is preparing to move into an Annual Progress Reporting cycle. Therefore, the February 2023 Progress Report requirement is being waived, and the next report will be due in August 2023. Be sure to check your DFC and CARA *Me* profiles to ensure that all requirements are met. Recipients can begin editing the Annual 2023 Progress Report found in DFC and CARA *Me* and can also use the Data Entry Tool found in the Learning Center.
- <u>Joint DFC Site Visits</u> The DFC Branch is continuing its efforts of hosting joint virtual site visits for *Current Year 4, 5, 9 and 10 recipients*. Monitor your inboxes for future invitations and additional visit details.
