

Deadlines and Deliverables

- **DFC Annual Performance Report (APR)** The DFC APR for recipients applying for *Support Years 2-5 and 7-10 only* is available via GrantSolutions and is due **March 15, 2023**. Guidance for the APR, which serves as the non-competing continuation application, can be found in GrantSolutions and has been shared via email. The recorded webinar can be found <a href="https://example.com/here.c
- <u>DFC Competing Continuation Application</u> For Current Year 5 recipients who wish to compete for Year 6 DFC funding, the application has posted via <u>grants.gov</u>. Questions about the application can be emailed to <u>DFC NOFO@cdc.gov</u>. The Competing Continuation Application is due *April 11, 2023*, and recorded webinars can be found <u>here</u>.
- <u>DFC Progress Report</u> The DFC Program is moving into an Annual Progress Reporting cycle. Therefore, the February 2023 Progress Report requirement is being waived. The next report will be due in August 2023 and will cover a reporting period of August 1, 2022, to July 31, 2023. Be sure to check your DFC and CARA *Me* profiles to ensure that all requirements are met. Recipients can begin editing the Annual 2023 Progress Report found in DFC and CARA *Me* and can also use the Data Entry Tool found in the Learning Center.
